Dear Colleagues

Your National Committee nominated Mr Augusto Da Silva Telles for the Piero Gazzola Prize 2008 to be awarded on the occasion of 16<sup>th</sup> General Assembly of ICOMOS, meeting in Quebec, Canada from 29 September to 4 October 2008.

The Prize Jury composed of (Chair of the Jury, Benjamin MOUTON (France); members: Yukio NISHIMURA (Japan); Zeynep AHUNBAY (Turkey); Dawson MUNJERI (Zimbabwe); Isabel RIGOL (Cuba) examined the seven high-quality nominations put forward by ICOMOS National Committees.

Several candidates had impressive track records of achievements and made significant contributions to the work of ICOMOS over the years – having to select only one candidate as laureate for the Prize therefore proved to be a difficult task for the Jury.

Following extensive deliberations, and based on the tradition that the Prize is not awarded posthumously, the Prize Jury decided to award the 2008 Piero Gazzola Prize to Ms Carmen Añón Feliú (Landscape architect, specialized in historic gardens, Professor of the history of gardens and restorer of historic gardens, Member of ICOMOS Spain, Honorary President of the ICOMOS-IFLA International Committee on Historic Gardens - now Cultural Landscapes, Former President of the Advisory Committee of ICOMOS 1992-1997), for her outstanding contribution to the work of our organisation, for over thirty years, in particular in favour of the cause of historic gardens and cultural landscapes.

The commemorative prize medal was handed over by Benjamin Mouton, Chair of the Jury, and Michael Petzet, outgoing ICOMOS President, to Mrs Añón Feliú during the closing dinner of the General Assembly in Quebec.

On the same occasion, 10 members were made *Honorary members* of ICOMOS:

Mr Juan-Benito Artigas Hernandez (Mexico); Mr Cyro Correa Lyra (Brazil); Mr Hernan Crespo Toral (Ecuador) – posthumously; Mr Tamas Fejerdy (Hungary); Mr Jonas Glemza (Lithuania); Mr Zahi Hawass (Egypt); Ms Birgitta Hoberg (Sweden); Mr Michel Jantzen (France); Mr Gilles Nourissier (France) – posthumously; Mr Kiyotari Tsuboi (Japan)

In order to conserve the prestigious and exceptional character of this distinction the Jury decided to limit the number of Honorary memberships to 10.

On behalf of the Chair of the Prize Jury, Mr Benjamin Mouton, and the Jury members, I wish to thank your National Committee for putting forward its nomination. Although the candidate you nominated was not selected for the Gazzola Prize on this occasion, please do not hesitate to put forward candidatures on the occasion of the 2011 General Assembly.
